GET POURING...

Here is a lovely activity found by Charlotte.

Why not set up a pouring station in the garden on warm days to keep little ones cool and entertained.

WHAT YOU NEED-

- Use a box or paddling pool
- Any items you have around the home, such as jugs, ladles, cups, watering cans

HOW TO DO IT-

1. fill up the box or paddling pool with warm water
2. place the jugs, cup and watering cans inside and watch your child pour the water to and from containers.



GET RECOGNISING...

Lets keep those brains working by doing some shape/number recognition.

Here is a lovely activity found by Yolanda which is a great way for your child to identify differnet shapes by finding objects which you will find in your lovely home.

WHAT YOU NEED-

- Tape – masking or electricians
- Coloured felt pens/pencils
- Paper
- Use chalk instead to turn into outdoor activity



HOW TO DO IT-

1. Draw a different shape on each piece of paper - no more than 4 shapes
2. Place them on the floor and divide the tape as shown in the picture
3. Ask your child to look around the house too see how many of each shape they can find.
4. Remember to ask them what shape they are look for - If your child is stuck don't worry by repeating the name of the shape they are looking for will help your child's long time memory
5. If you are using different colours you could ask them what colour the shape is
6. If you want to take this outside use the chalk to draw the line instead of tape.

Alternative

You could put numbers in place of the shapes and ask your child to park objects in the shape to show the correct number of objects



GET GROWING...

Here is a lovely activity found by Tracy where you can watch and grow.

You can also cut off the sprouts and use them in a salad (they are supposed to taste like parsley)

WHAT YOU NEED-

- Carrots
- A deep tray
- Jug of water



HOW TO DO IT-

1. Cut the tops off a few carrots and make sure the tops measure at least 1cm in length
2. Place the carrot tops in an empty container, making sure that the top is only covered in water
3. Place them in warm, sunny place and let your child watch them sprout over the next few days
