GET BIRD FEEDING...

Wow who can remember from week 1 when we had milk carton elephants?

Well here is another great way to transform a milk carton in to a bird feeder

WHAT YOU NEED-

- Milk carton
- String
- Bird Seed
- Pens
- Scissors
- Stickers



HOW TO DO IT-

1. Wash out your old milk carton and make sure you dry it as best as you can
2. Use a pen to draw the outline for the doors and two holes at the top of the milk carton for the string to go through
3. Cut across the line on the milk carton and make doors to open.
4. Decorate your milk carton however you like
5. Add the bird seed to the bottom

Or you can make a bird feeder by rolling an old kitchen roll tube in peanut butter and then into bird seed and hang it up in your garden using the string



GET GARDENING...

We all love our garden at nursery.

Here is a great way to make a fairy garden to share your garden with you at home!

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Plant pot
- Compost/top soil
- flowers
- cardboard door



HOW TO DO IT:

1. Fill your pot with compost or top soil
2. Plant your flowers
3. get creative and find special things fairies might like that you already have at home
4. Cut a door out of cardboard and place in to the pot
5. Now wait for your fairies to visit you

GET FREEZING...

What a lovely way to see flowers in a different form
Why not try freezing them and watching the melt on a nice sunny day!

WHAT YOU NEED-

- Ice cube tray
- Water
- Flowers

HOW TO DO IT-

1. Pick some of your favourite flowers
2. Cut them up if they are big so you can freeze them in your ice cube tray
3. Once placed into the ice cube tray and add water
4. Carefully place them into the freezer (adult to do this)
5. Wait a few hours or over night till fully frozen
6. Place on a tray or bowl and watch them melt
